pregnant women and new mothers (-> new borns)



Keep up and/or provide



- Roles (personal and professional)
- Rules (family rules and on-site rules such as

media access ...)

Routines (timetables, different spaces, ...)













Handling unaccompanied children



- First contact at registration
- Question of legal aspects
- Close contact with local authorities
- Person for children (Tutor): Male? Female?
- Definition: what is a "child" in different cultures?















Organization:

- Keep children busy!
- Daily routine (meals, sleep, play etc.)
- Access control
- Basic health care
- Support network for children
- Registration and identification
- Protected area for nursing, diaper room, supervised play area















Management:

- Permanent contact person for children issues for parents
- Target group manager or children issue manager
- SOP if necessary, e.g. for unaccompanied children (see Child Friendly Spaces and Child Safety concepts of UNICEF)
- Rules and enforcement of rules
- Psychological assistance
- Cultural awareness measures (for 12 year-olds and above)
- Definition and identification of needs















Children issues:

Protected playground (design differs over time)

Equipment:

- Fencing if necessary or play areas within buildings
- Access control
- Basic consumables
- Children hygienic kit (until 12 years)















Staff:

- Specialized trained personnel
- Different experts (psychologist, ...)
- Basic trained staff (reduces stress!)
- Contact person for children issues
- Staff with official certificate of good conduct
- Code of conduct















Organization:

- Keep children busy!
- Daily routine (meals, sleep, play sports, learn, psychoeducation)
- Information only under supervision, slowly accession
- Paediatric care, contact to psychologists
- Activity, play, private zones
- Separate areas for families















Management:

- Small groups of children (nice to have)
- Children issues:
- Child friendly spaces (i.e.) UNICEF Guidelines)















Equipment:

- Comfortable area (nice to have)
- Playground
- Many-purpose toys
- Music / TV Room
- Tent for school / kindergarten
- Sports

















Staff:

- Children supervision
- MORE CARETAKERS (numbers of children is key)
- Children manager dedicated in the Camp Management Board
- Focused psychosocial care
- Volunteers from camp guests













Registering children



some examples:

Name

Date of birth/ age

Residence

If necessary, affected area where someone was evacuated from

Family affiliation within - and if necessary outside - the ETS (parents/caregiver, children)

Nutrition (baby food, vegetarian, ...)

...and so on...


